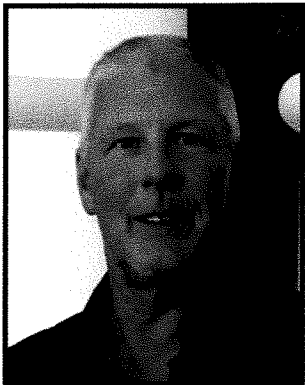
## Jeff Dick-- Class of 1984

## Brian Hogan-- Class of 1978

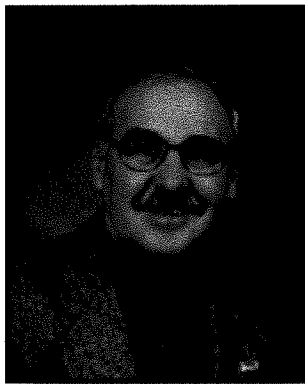
**Football 1976-1978** – Three-year letter winner, All conference defense 1978. Selected to the Shrine Football game.

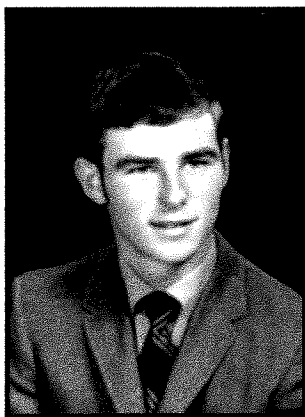

**Gymnastics**—Part of the 1968 non-sanctioned state championship team and the 1969 and 1970 state championship teams. Remaining undefeated for three years!

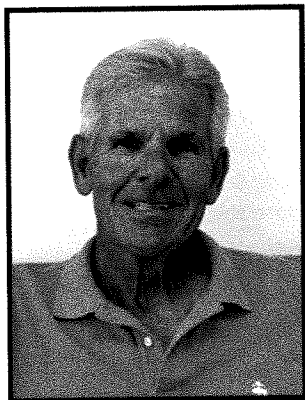

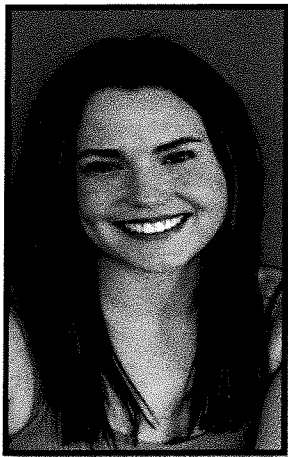

The 1969 Blue Jay Girls Gymnastics team was the first State Championship Team for Jamestown High School in girls' athletics in the first sanctioned gymnastics meet sponsored by the North Dakota High School Activities Association. Behind a deluge of strong performances in the top two divisions, Dolores Paulson's Jamestown delegation steamed relentlessly to the championship of the first North Dakota High School girls' gymnastics meet. The team scored 197.9 team points for a comfortable lead on runner-up Bismarck St. Mary's which totaled 135.3. Jamestown gymnasts earned two of three individual all-around titles. Valerie Boatright, in a first season of all-around competition, mopped up in Intermediate Division activity. Veteran Barbara Mitchell easily took the Junior Division crown. All-around places are computed from results of individuals in four events – uneven parallel bars, balance beam, side horse vault and floor exercise. Trampoline and tumbling were special events here. In the individual events, Jamestown had 11 firsts, including five of six in the Junior Division. The local team notched four of six firsts in Intermediate activity. Jamestown was particularly awesome in Junior competition with sweeps of all six top positions in parallel bars and side horse vault. Miss Mitchell closed second in bars, first in side horse vault and first in floor exercise in the Junior division. She was tied for third in balance beam. She received a standing ovation when awards were made. Miss Boatright was a winner in Intermediate balance beam and side horse vault and was fourth in Junior Division parallel bars. She finished fifth in Junior floor exercise. Jamestown was competing without four first-rank gymnasts because of injury or illness.

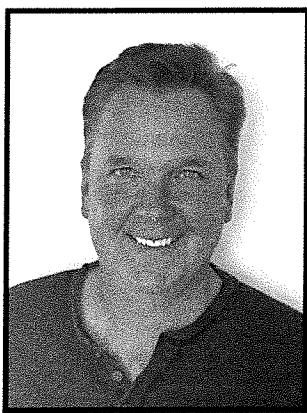
**Soccer:** Two season letter winner. Led the team to a state runner up title and named to the all state tournament team in 2009.

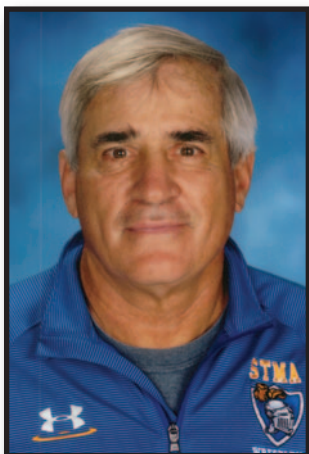

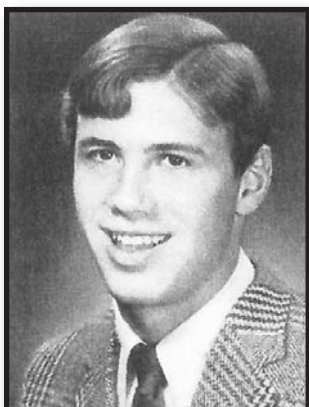
